Our belief regarding the "Lord's Supper", also known as Holy Communion, is that it is a joyous sacred act established by Christ Himself and given as a gift to the Church. God's Word teaches: Let a man examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink of the cup. (1 Cor. 11:28-29).

Therefore, in accordance with Scripture, and out of loving care for all, we invite all to join us at His table who:

· Confess and sincerely repent of all your sins. (1 John 1:8-9)

Believe that only through the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus, does God forgive your sins and give you newness of life (Is. 53:4-6; Rom. 6:23; 2 Cor 5:17)
Believe that in and with the bread and wine, you receive not merely a symbol, but the true Body & Blood of Christ, for the forgiveness of your sins and the strengthening of your faith. (1 Cor. 10:16; Matt. 26:28)

Recognize that participation at the Lord's Table is a "proclaiming of the Lord's death" (1 Cor. 11:26) and indicates public agreement with the Biblical teaching of the Sacrament and a oneness in faith in Christ alone as Savior.

If you cannot receive wine, grape juice is in the center of the tray. If you need gluten-free wafers, please let Pastor know. If you cannot come to the altar, please let the usher know so Pastor can serve you at your seat. Non-communing children may join their parents and receive a blessing.

On Sunday, May 19, 2024, at the Congregational Meeting ("the Voters Meeting"), an election will be held for four Board of Directors positions.

- The meeting will be held at 9:15 am between our regular services.
- Please note that per our Constitution, no nominations are permitted from the floor during the Voters Meeting.
- Absentee ballots have been attached to the Grace Notes and may also be picked up at the church.
- The Biographies of those who have accepted nominations and met the qualifications below are printed here. (incumbent*)

A person is eligible to serve on the Board if they meet at least four of the following qualifications:

- 1. Join in worship at Amazing Grace at least 75% of the regularly held services
- 2. Participate in Sunday Bible Class and/or Small Group Bible Study
- 3. Share the Good News of Jesus personally as evidenced through bringing people to worship, activities and Bible Studies
- 4. Regularly serve the congregation and/or community by using their individual gifts
- 5. Strives to contribute 10% or more of their income toward the work of God's Kingdom

In addition, Officers and lay leaders shall be looked to as model disciples of Christ who live according to God's Word and Commandments.



The Amazing Grace Board of Directors is the governing body of the church, working with the Pastor to determine policies, financial business, capital projects, ministry matters that are not already assigned to various committees, and more.

The Board of Directors is made up of seven members who serve two-year terms for a maximum of three terms. Elections are held each Spring for any Board positions that need to be filled. The Board meets once a month and communicates via email in between if needed.



ROBERT (BOB) KIEHL*: Bob has been a member the LCMS his entire life and a member of Amazing Grace for the past three years.
